2. GENERAL MOTORS CORPORATION	75

4. MONSANTO CO.	56
Monsanto Company is a subsidiary of Pharmacia Corporation.	
5. UNION CARBIDE CORP.	51
The Union Carbide Corporation has merged with and is a subsidiary of The Dow Chemical Company.	
6. MOBIL OIL CORP/CHEMICAL CO	41
Mobil was acquired by Exxon. The new company name is EXXON MOBIL CORPORATION. [Shown both with and without a space between Exxon and Mobil. Text here taken from "exact" name entry in U.S. SEC document.]	
7. WESTINGHOUSE ELECTRIC CORP	41
Under restructuring of the Corporation, Westinghouse Electric Company (WELCO) retained the manufacturing and services businesses for the nuclear and fossil-fueled power generation industry and the government operations business and certain environmental liability. Westinghouse Electric Company, according to its website, is "one of four major business groups of British Nuclear Fuels (BNFL). Westinghouse Electric Company LLC is wholly owned by BNFL Nuclear Services Inc. (BNSI) which in turn is wholly owned by BNFL USA Group, Inc. (The successor company to Westinghouse Electric Corp. may be CBS but I would have to research this further.)	
8. BROWNING FERRIS INDUSTRIES	38

BFI has been acquired by Allied Waste Industries, Inc.

9. CIBA-GEIGY CORP. 37

Ciba-Geigy no longer exists with that name. It evolved into other companies, Novartis International, and also, Ciba Specialty Chemicals, Inc. To summarize major points: 1971 - Merger of Ciba and Geigy into Ciba-Geigy; 1992 - company renamed Ciba; 1996 - Sandoz and Ciba merge or integrate into Novartis; 1997 - Ciba Specialty Chemicals gets spun-off from Novartis; 2000 - The Ciba Performance Polymers division is sold to form a new company Vantico.

10. OLIN CORPORATION 37

11. ASHLAND CHEMICAL CO. 36

From the former Ashland Chemical Company two new companies were created, Ashland Distribution Company and Ashland Specialty Chemical Company. These are divisions of Ashland, Inc.

12. DOW CHEMICAL CO. 36

See #5 above.

13. ALLIED SIGNAL INC. 34

AlliedSignal [no space between] entered into a merger agreement with Honeywell Inc. and the name of the company changed from AlliedSignal Inc. to Honeywell International Inc.

14. CHEVRON USA, INC. 33

The report filed with the U.S. SEC for Chevron U.S.A. Inc (the only report found) appears to say that the company is a subsidiary of Chevron Corporation. Apparently, Chevron has now merged with Texaco. The new name is CHEVRONTEXACO [no space between] CORPORATION.

15. TEXACO, INC. 33

See #14 above. Texaco and Chevron merged to form ChevronTexaco Corp. As a result of the Merger, Texaco became a wholly owned subsidiary of Chevron. In addition, Chevron changed its name to "ChevronTexaco Corporation" in connection with the Merger .

16. ALLIED CHEMICAL CORP. 32

See #13 above. Allied Chemical Corp. is apparently a former name or predecessor of AlliedSignal which in turn is a former name of HONEYWELL INTERNATIONAL INC.

17. SHELL OIL CO. 32

Parents are Royal Dutch Petroleum Company and The "Shell" Transport and Trading Company, p.l.c., The Parent Companies directly or indirectly own the shares in the Group Holding Companies but are not themselves part of the Royal Dutch/Shell Group of Companies. (This is the relationship as defined on the website.)

18. AMERICAN CYANAMID COMPANY 31

American Cyanamid was acquired by American Home Products. AHP later changed its name to Wyeth. The exact name in the charter is "Wyeth," nothing more.

19. HERCULES INC. 30

20. PPG INDUSTRIES, INC. 30

21. CHRYSLER CORPORATION 29

New name is DaimlerCrysler AG

22. REICHHOLD CHEMICALS, INC. 28

Reichhold, Inc., formerly Reichhold Chemicals, Inc., is a subsidiary of Dainippon Ink & Chemicals, Tokyo.

23. EXXON CORP. 27

See #6 above. Mobil was acquired by Exxon. The new company name is EXXON MOBIL CORPORATION. [Shown both with and without a space between Exxon and Mobil. Text here taken from "exact" name entry in U.S. SEC document.]

24. HOECHST CELANESE CORPORATION 27

In 1987 Hoechst AG acquired Celanese Corporation to form Hoechst Celanese Corporation. It appears that Hoechst Celanese Corporation had a parent company called Hoechst Corporation, which in turn had a parent company called Hoechst Aktiengesellschaft (otherwise known as Hoechst AG ?) Certain specialty chemicals functions were spun off to Clariant AG in 1997. In 1998 and 1999, Hoechst Celanese "demerged" and spun-off its chemical activities into Celanese AG. Then, Hoechst Aktiengesellschaft and Rhone-Poulenc SA merged to form Aventis SA based in Strasbourg, France. Hoechst AG retains an identity as an intermediate holding company that operates as an affiliate of Aventis SA. Hoechst Corporation apparently was renamed Celanese Americas Corporation. Its new parent is Celanese AG.

25. NL INDUSTRIES, INC. 26

26. AMERICAN CAN COMPANY 25

Amoco Corp. merged with The British Petroleum Co. plc. Parent became BP Amoco plc, then recently was renamed to BP plc

- 32. U.S. AIR FORCE 24
- 33. ATLANTIC RICHFIELD COMPANY 23

See #29 above. Atlantic Richfield Co. was acquired by BP Amoco, now called BP plc

- 34. OCCIDENTAL CHEMICAL CORP. 23

Parent company is Occidental Petroleum Corp.

- 35. STAUFFER CHEMICAL CO. 23

See #24 for more on Aventis SA. Stauffer Chemical was purchased by Rhone-Poulenc Inc. Aventis is the successor to Rhone-Poulenc Inc. It is not clear to me exactly what role Stauffer Management currently has, although it has Superfund liabilities from the original Stauffer Chemical. It is apparently a separate entity from Stauffer Chemical Co.

- 36. REYNOLDS METALS COMPANY 21

Reynolds Metals is now owned by Alcoa Inc.

- 38. ALUMINUM COMPANY OF AMERICA 20

Name was changed to Alcoa Inc..

- 40. BURLINGTON NORTHERN RAILROAD 20

The Burlington Northern Railroad Company (BNRR) has become the Burlington Northern and Santa Fe Railway Company (BNSF Railway or Company), a subsidiary of the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Corporation (BNSF).

Report Criteria

Includes PRPs that are listed in the National data base with the Noticed/Enf Action flag checked (they must have received a Special Notice Letter, a general Notice Letter, or be linked to a settlement document). Those parties where the "Not PRP Determination Made" flag was activated are excluded from the count.

The number one PRP is linked to the most sites nationally. The number two PRP is linked to the second highest number of sites. PRPs linked to an identical number of sites are listed in alphabetical order on the report.

List includes only PRPs that were linked to NPL sites (Final or Deleted sites only).

PRPs linked to Federal Facility sites are not included.

Total De Minimis database settlers are not included.
